What are Indefinite Pronouns?



What are **Indefinite Pronouns**?

Indefinite pronouns are used to refer
to a person, place, or thing that
ARE NOT SPECIFIC

Specific: I need Pablo to help me.

Not specific: I need **someone** to help me.

What are **Indefinite Pronouns**?

They can be plural, singular or both:

Singular: I would like another glass of water please.

Plural: Both of us would like some water please.

Plural: The storm affected many of costal cities.

Plural/Singluar: All of you are invited.

Plural/Singular: All of the album is good.

What are Indefinite Pronouns?

MOST COMMON indefinite pronouns

	Person	Place	Thing
ALL:	everyone everybody	everywhere	everything
part (pos):	someone somebody	somewhere	something
part (neg):	anyone anybody	anywhere	anything
NONE:	no one nobody	nowhere	nothing

FORM

Indefinite Pronouns

Indefinite pronouns go in the same place as a normal noun:

I want to go to **Berlin** next year.

Cecilia said it is a good series.

I won't tell **Sam**..

She bought her **shoes** at the mall.

We haven't heard the **news** yet.

I want to go to **somewhere** fun next year.

Someone said it is a good series.

I won't tell **anyone**.

She bought **everything** at the mall.

We haven't heard **anything** yet.

USE

Indefinite Pronouns

AFFIRMATIVE

We use **some** for in positive sentences

We could meet tomorrow morning? I have some extra time between 10-11:00.

There is something I need to tell you.

USE

Indefinite Pronouns

NEGATIVE

We use any in negative sentences and questions:

We don't have any more food left.

I don't know anyone who doesn't like some form of chocolate.

FORM

Indefinite Pronouns

QUESTIONS

If we think the answer will be yes or for polite offers we use
'some'.

Would you like something else?

Can somebody please help me?

FORM

Indefinite Pronouns

Using any with if:

**If there is any food left, you can take it home.
If anyone has any questions, I would be happy to answer.
Let me know if you need anything.**

FORM

Indefinite Pronouns

We use any when 'it doesn't matter'

You can get any train. They all go through that station. (whichever)

You can choose any of the models in black, but blue and red are sold out. (whichever)

They can sit anywhere they want to (wherever)

Anybody can use it. (whoever)
