Which one is better?

- There is no "best accent"
- Native speakers often have misunderstanding.
- Avoid confusion by using the IPA.
- Regional differences can be huge!

The unstressed syllable

Transforming the vowel

our	fav <u>ou</u> r
	/ə/
ion	fash <u>io</u> n
	/ə/

The syllable is unstressed, the vowel can **disappear** or **change**. If the vowel changes, it becomes the famous /ə/ sound. The Schwa is the **most common sound** in English.



The schwa in practise

The schwa is directly connected to the stress.

So, when do we use it?

That depends on the type of word.

In general, we use a schwa before or after a **stressed** syllable

The Schwa

A result of the stress





Syllable rules

- 1 syllable words: **content** vs **function** words
- 2 syllable words: adjectives + nouns vs verbs
- 3 + syllable words: depends on the ending of the root word

Content vs Function words
