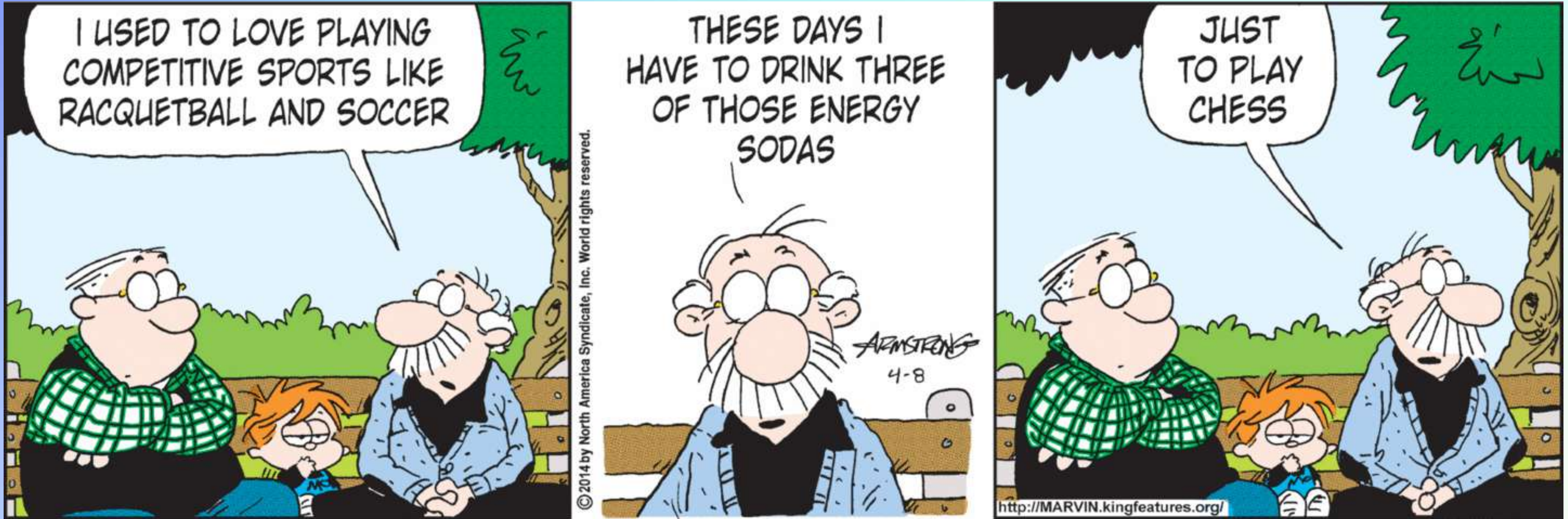

(infinitive) to use = usar

(adjective) it is used = está usado

(present simple) I use it = lo uso

(passive -past) it was used to ... = se lo usó para...

USED TO VS. PAST SIMPLE:

USED TO = during an undefined long period of time in the past.

I used to have more free time before having kids.

PAST SIMPLE = a more definite period of time in the past.

I had more free time before having kids.

I had more free time last month compared to this month.

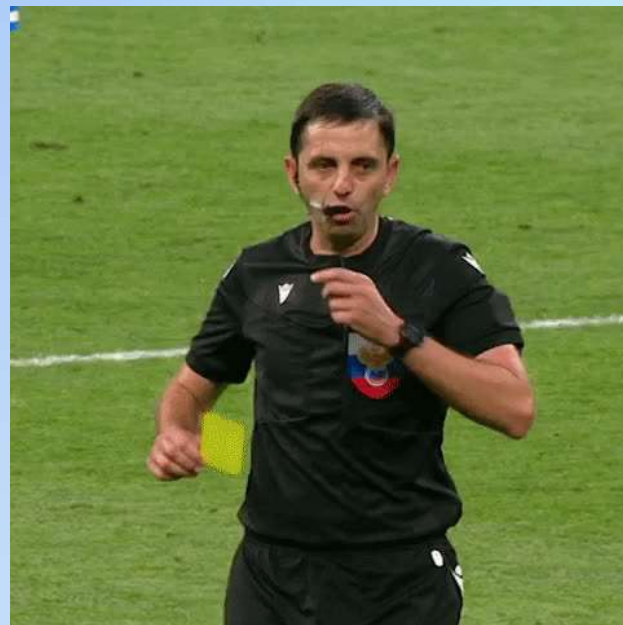

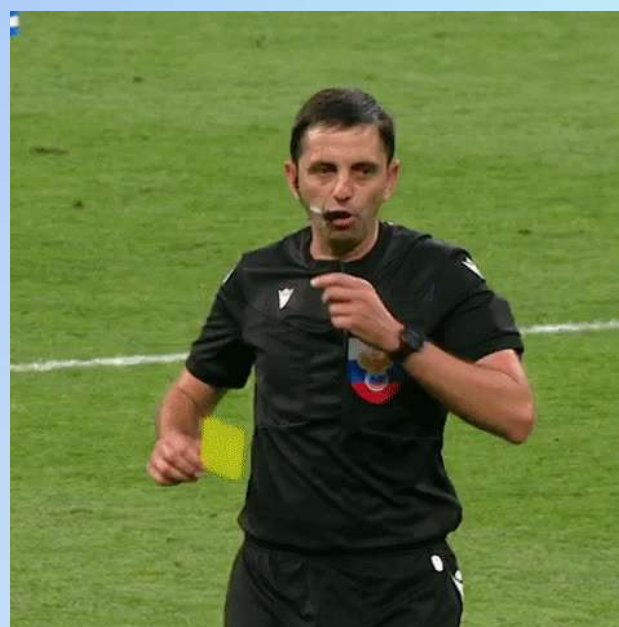

First, we have to clarify the difference between free time and time off:

free time = time for yourself.



time off = time away from work.

Talking about free time

'Free time' or leisure time'

is one of the most valued commodities of our modern era.

Let's look at how we talk about it in English.

First, we have to clarify the difference between free time and time off:

free time = time for yourself.

time off = time away from work.

EXAMPLE:

*I have tomorrow **off** (from work), but I won't have much **free time**. I have a doctor's appointment in the morning and then I have to help my sister move house. I will have more **free time** this weekend to relax.*

VERBS – There are many ways to say what you like to do:

I like painting in my free time. Me gusta pintar en mi tiempo libre.

I enjoy painting. Disfruto pintando.

I'm fond of painting. Soy aficionado a la pintura.

I'm keen on painting. Me interesa mucho pintar.

I'm passionate about painting. Soy un apasionado de la pintura.

I'm into painting. Me mola la pintura.

I love painting. Me encanta pintar.

I paint in my free time. Pinto en mi tiempo libre.

I spend a lot of time painting when I can. Paso mucho tiempo pintando cuando puedo.

(NOTE: we don't say: I pass a lot of time.) (NOTA: no decimos: 'pass' mucho tiempo).

Hobbies & Activities

How do we talk about hobbies and activities?

Adverbs – Common adverbs we use include:
regularly, often, frequently

I **often** restore cars on weekends.

A menudo restauro autos los fines de semana.

I volunteer for the cancer society **regularly**.

Soy voluntario de la sociedad contra el cáncer con regularidad.

We **frequently** go camping in the Pyreneese.

Frecuentemente vamos de acampada a los Pirineos.

Hobbies & Activities

How do we talk about hobbies and activities?

Benefits – When talking about the benefit we get from different activities we can say:

(Generally) it helps me...

relax/unwind (it's relaxing, de-stressing)

chill out / kick back (it's fun, social, entertaining)

disconnect (it's interesting, exciting, imaginative, I forget about work)

recharge my batteries (it gives me energy, it rejuvenates me, makes me happy)

relajarse/descansar (es relajante, desestresante)

relajarse / relajarse (es divertido, social, entretenido)

desconectar (es interesante, emocionante, imaginativo, me olvido del trabajo)

recargar mis pilas (me da energía, me rejuvenece, me hace feliz)

Benefits – When talking about the benefit we get from different activities we can say:

(Physically) it helps me...

get fit	Ponerse en forma
get in shape	Ponerse en forma
stay/keep in shape	mantenerse en forma
lose weight	perder peso
keep the weight off	mantener el peso fuera
feel good	sentirse bien

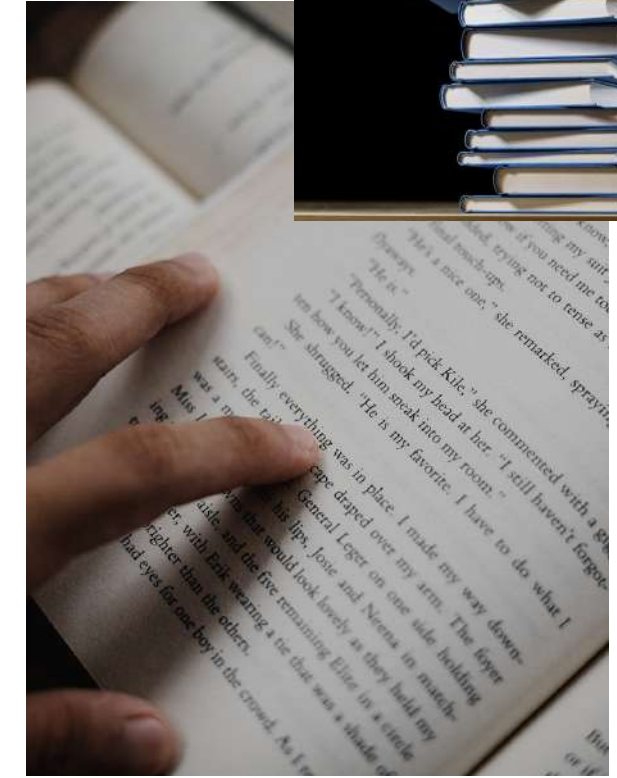

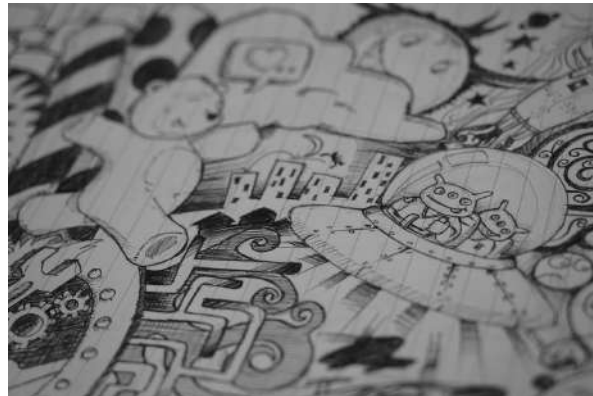

Rule 5:

Generally, we do NOT usually use ‘**practice**’ when referring to general hobbies, unless 1) talking about the activity that focuses on a specific technique, 2) martial art-type discipline, or 3) if it refers to preparation for a competition or performance such as with music, dance or a game.

“I **practice** meditation.”

“He needs to **practice** his passing techniques.”

“She’s going to dance **practice**.”
