(3rd person singular: infinitive + 's')

he / she / it speaks







Present Simple

NEGATIVE

J don't work
you don't work
we don't work
they don't work





Present Simple

NEGATIVE

he doesn't work she doesn't work it doesn't work

(3rd person singular: does not + verb)

Present Simple

1. Things which are always (or usually) true:

Water (normally) boils at 100 degrees centigrade.

Jarod (usually) prefers Mac.





Present Simple

2. **Permanent** situations (or nearly; true for a few years at least):

Dave lives near an IT services company.

Anne works for a digital marketing agency.





Present Simple

3. Habits or things we do regularly:

Employees in that department <u>usually</u> work remotely on Tuesdays.

She browses the news every morning.





Present Simple

4.To talk about what happens in books, plays, films and series:

In her new book the main character goes back in time and alters the technology advances.

In the second episode Charlie accesses the company's server and steals the data.

Present Simple

5. Future events which are part of a timetable

The next system back up runs at midnight.

The company communicates updates to the system every month.





Present Simple (QUESTIONS)

'DO' + subject + main verb

Do | work...?

Do you work...?

(3rd per. sing.: Does + subj. + main verb)







Present Simple (QUESTIONS)

'BE' + subject

Am I next?

Are you next?

Are we next?

Are they next?

Is he/she/it next?







Present Simple (QUESTIONS)

YES or NO?

(CLOSED QUESTIONS)

Do you use that app?

Yes, I use that app.

Yes, I do. / No, I don't.

DO

Does he use that app?

No, he doesn't use that app.

Yes, he does. /No he doesn't.





Present Simple (QUESTIONS)

YES or NO?

(CLOSED QUESTIONS)

Are you ready?

Yes I am.

BE

Are they certain?

Yes, they are. / No, they aren't.

Is she on the way?

Yes she is. / No, she isn't.

Is it this one?

Yes, it is. / No it isn't.



Can vs Be able to

CAN

"Can" is a modal verb used to express general ability, capability or permission.

It's more commonly used in everyday speech and informal situations.

It is used for <u>present and future tenses</u>. It doesn't require an auxiliary verb (like "be") in its negative or question forms.





Can vs Be able to

BE ABLE TO

"Be able to" is a phrase that also indicates ability, <u>but it often suggests a</u>

<u>specific instance or situation</u>.

It's more formal and is often used in written English.

It's used in all forms of tenses (<u>past, present, future</u>) and can convey a sense of accomplishment or <u>overcoming obstacles</u>.





Can vs Be able to

EXAMPLES

1. Can: I can download the latest software update on my phone.

Be able to: He was able to fix the computer virus after hours of troubleshooting.

2. Can: Can you send me the document through email?

Be able to: Even with limited resources, they were able to develop a new app quickly.





Can vs Be able to

EXAMPLES

3. Can: The new software update can fix several bugs in the system.

Be able to: Despite the <u>initial doubts</u>, the team was able to implement the new security plan successfully.

4. Can: The new printer can produce color documents at a high speed.

Be able to: Despite the technical difficulties, they were still able to livestream the event.

False Cognate: A word that looks similar in two languages BUT has a different meaning.



Spanish word: actual / actualmente

False equivalent:

'actual' / 'actually'

= real / realmente

Ex: In my actual job, I'm responsible for data analysis.

False Friends

Correct word: current / currently

Definition:

now, presently,
at the present time

Ex: In my **current** job, I'm responsible for data analysis.





Spanish word: introducir

False equivalent:

'introduce'

= presentarse

Ex: You need to introduce the USB drive and then introduce your password.

False Friends

Correct word: insert / enter

Definition:
to put inside, to fill in a blank space

Ex: You need to **insert** the USB drive and then **enter** your password.





Spanish word: friki

False equivalent:

'freak' / 'freaky'

= person, animal with an unusual physical abnormality / scary

Ex: He is freaky with computers.

False Friends

Correct word: geek, nerd

Definition:

knowledgeable and obsessively interested

Ex: He is **geeky** with computers. / He is a computer **geek**.





Spanish word: datos (personales)

False equivalent:

'data' / 'dates'

= datos informaticos / fechas

Ex: Your personal data is confidential.

Ex: Your personal dates is confidential.

False Friends

Correct word: information

Definition:
name, address,

phone number, etc.

Ex: Your personal information is confidential.






