



Key verbs for your eyes and ears!

VERBS: To...

EXAMPLES:

Look here. Look at this picture!
I need to look up the definition.
I'm looking for a new good series to watch.
Have you seen the newest series on Netflix?
Did you see the news today?
Are you going to watch the game tonight?
Did you hear in the news that scientists found a stone-age mega structure on the bottom of the ocean?!
I was listening to the radio when I heard about it.
Have you noticed? - This video has 1.2 million likes!





Key verbs!

VERBS: To...

SEE = physical ability / quick reference I can't see the picture very well. We saw a great movie last weekend.

LOOK (at) = specific focus for a short moment
Look at what he's wearing!
The doctor looked at her back and said it was ok.

WATCH = to look at something moving / with motion / with extended attention
What did you do last night? We watched a movie.

Do you want to watch tonight?

Did you watch the match last night?

I like watching horror films.





Key verbs!

VERBS: To...

HEAR = physical ability / quick reference

I can't hear you very well. Can you check your sound.
I can't hear it very well. Can you turn it up, please.
I heard from a podcast that gluten allergies are increasing.

LISTEN TO = specific focus for a short moment

If you listen to what he is saying, I think it makes a lot of sense.

I was listening to the radio driving to work this morning when I heard about his death.



(a new = una nueva)

The news are not good today. >>> The news is not good today.

SERIES:

I watched a really good serie last night. >>> I watched a really good series last night.

I watched several complete series last year. (plural)



Most Popular Social Media Platforms in 2024







like, love, hate, enjoy

LIKE: to express enjoyment or preference for something

I like watching the news in the morning.

Me gusta ver las noticias por la mañana.

In her free time she likes reading about fashion.

En su tiempo libre le gusta leer sobre moda.





like, love, hate, enjoy

LIKE + VERB+ING:

indicates enjoyment or pleasure derived from an ongoing.action or activity that someone does regularly.

I like watching the news in the morning.

Me gusta ver las noticias por la mañana.

In her free time she <u>likes reading</u> about fashion.

En su tiempo libre le gusta leer sobre moda.





like, love, hate, enjoy

LIKE + TO + VERB: indicates a preference or desire for specific action or particular way of doing an activity

I like to watch the news in the morning.

Me gusta ver las noticias por la mañana.

<u>In her free time</u> she likes <u>to read</u> about fashion.

En su tiempo libre le gusta leer sobre moda.





like, love, hate, enjoy

LOVE

to express deep affection or strong preference

I love watching my favorite TV show every week.

Me encanta ver mi programa de televisión favorito todas las semanas.

I love to relax on Friday nights with a movie.

Me encanta relajarme los viernes por la noche con una película.





like, love, hate, enjoy

HATE

to express strong dislike or aversion towards something.

I hate when the news is full of negative stories.

Odio cuando las noticias están llenas de historias negativas.

I hate having a bad wifi connection.

Odio tener una mala conexión wifi.





like, love, hate, enjoy

ENJOY

to express pleasure or satisfaction from an activity or experience.

I enjoy browsing social media in my free time.

Disfruto navegando por las redes sociales en mi tiempo libre.

We enjoy reading online articles about technology and innovation.

Disfrutamos leyendo artículos en línea sobre tecnología e innovación.



Present Simple vs Present Continuous

infinitive

AFFIRMATIVE 'be' with verb+ing

speak

you **speak** we speak they speak I am speaking

you are speaking we are speaking they are speaking

(3rd person singular: infinitive + 's')

he / she / it speaks

(3rd person singular: be + 's') he / she / it is speaking





Present Simple vs Present Continuous

infinitive

AFFIRMATIVE 'be' with verb+ing

speak

you speak
we speak
they speak

(3rd person singular: infinitive + 's')
he / she / it speaks

I'm speaking

you're speaking we're speaking they're speaking

(3rd person singular: be + 's')
he's / she's / it's speaking





Present Simple vs Present Continuous

infinitive

AFFIRMATIVE 'be' with verb+ing

speak

you speak

we speak they speak I'm speaking

you're speaking

we're speaking

they're speaking

(3rd person singular: infinitive + 's')

he / she / it speaks

(3rd person singular: be + 's')

he's / she's / it's speaking





Present Simple vs Present Continuous

S + don't/doesn't + verb NEGATIVE S + 'be' + not +verb+ing

I don't like this movie.

You **don't** like this movie. We **don't** like this movie. They **don't** like this movie.

He doesn't like this movie.

She doesn't like this movie.

It (the dog) doesn't like this movie.

I am not enjoying this movie.

You are not enjoying this movie. We are not enjoying this movie. They are not enjoying this movie.

He is not enjoying this movie.

She is not enjoying this movie.

It is not enjoying this movie.



Present Simple vs Present Continuous

S + don't/doesn't + verb NEGATIVE

I don't like this movie.

You **don't** like this movie. We **don't** like this movie. They **don't** like this movie.

He doesn't like this movie.

She doesn't like this movie.

It (the dog) doesn't like this movie.

S + 'be' + not +verb+ing

I am not enjoying this movie.

You aren't enjoying this movie.
We aren't enjoying this movie.
They aren't enjoying this movie.

He **isn't enjoying** this movie.

She **isn't enjoying** this movie.

It **isn't enjoying** this movie.

Do you listen to podcasts?Do we listen to podcasts?Do they listen to podcasts?

Does he listen to podcasts?Does she listen to podcasts?Does it listen to podcasts?

Am I listening to any podcasts?

Are you listening to any podcasts?
Are we listening to any podcasts?
Are they listening to any podcasts?

Is he listening to any podcasts?

Is she listening to any podcasts?

Is it listening to any podcasts?

Present Simple

vs Present Continuous

1. Things which are always (or usually) true:

Water boils at 100 degrees centigrade.

Jarod is Jenny's little brother.

1.Things which are happening at the moment of speaking:

The water is boiling **now**, so add the pasta.

Jarod is being very nice to Jenny today.





Present Simple

vs Present Continuous

2. **Permanent** situations (or nearly; true for a few years at least):

Dave lives in Nashville Tennessee.

Anne works for a marketing agency.

2. Temporary situations:

Alison is living in Spain <u>this year</u> to learn Spanish.

Currently Jake **is working** as a waiter for the summer at the beach side cafe.





Present Simple vs Present Continuous

3. **Habits** or things we do regularly:

Employees in that department usually eat at 1:30pm.

She drinks coffee every morning.

3. Temporary or new habits:

Employees in that department are eating <u>right now</u>.

She is drinking coffee a lot this week due to the extra-long hours at work.





Present Simple vs Present Continuous

4.To talk about what happens in books, plays, films and series:

In her new book the main character meets a stranger and falls in love.

In the second episode Charlie **gets** into trouble with the law again.

4. To talk about people in pictures and photos:

She's smiling a lot in that picture.

You can see they **are** really **having** a great time on the beach.





Present Simple vs Present Continuous

5. **Future events** which are part of a **timetable**

(future)

5. Definite **future** plans:

The next train to Piccadilly Circus leaves at 11:32.

I'll call you as soon as the plane lands to the airport.

We are leaving early <u>Friday morning</u> for our trip London.

I'm meeting with my boss tomorrow afternoon to talk about the new project.

Spanish word: noticia

False equivalent:

notice

= un aviso

Error: In the notice they showed highligts of the game.

False Friends (1)

Correct word: news

Definition:

information or reports about recent events

In the news they showed highlights of the game.





Spanish word: capitulo

False equivalent: chapter

= capitulo de libro (solo)

Error: I watched two chapters of the series last night.

False Friends (2)

Correct word: episode

Definition:

single parts of a story/series on television, radio or podcast

I watched two episodes of the series last night.





Spanish word: red

False equivalent:

net

= red de fibra

Error: They spend a lot of time on social nets.

False Friends (3)

Correct word:

network / media web / internet

Definition:

internet, newspapers, magazines, television, etc., considered as a group

They spend a lot of time on social media/networks.





Spanish word: fuente (de informacion) False equivalent:

fountain

= fuente de agua

Error: What is your preferred fountain for news?

Correct word: source

Definition:

someone or something that supplies information



What is your preferred source for news?





Spanish word: un comercial (la persona)

False equivalent:

commercial

= publicidad

Error: He is a commercial for the company.

False Friends (5)

Correct word:
sales person/representative

Definition:
someone who sells product or services for the company



He is a sales rep for the company.





Spanish word: una marca

False equivalent: a mark

= una marca dejado encima de un superficie (solo)

Error: This is a good mark for this product.

False Friends (6)

Correct word: brand

Definition:


a type of product made by a particular company and sold under a particular name



This is a good brand for this product.
