



Art & Culture Basic Definitions

Art = covering all creative expression

Art = fine art such as painting, drawing and sculpture

Arts = various creative fields collectively / subjects such as commerce, economics, philosophy, history and other such <u>non-science subjects</u>

The arts = these fields in a more formal or institutional context with artistic expression (includes visual, literary, performing, and sometimes applied arts)

Fine art = creating works for aesthetic purposes, without practical function (painting, sculpture, architecture, photography, printmaking, and other forms)

Fine arts = refers to multiple academic disciplines within fine art (includes painting, sculpture, drawing, and often music, theater, and dance)





Art & Culture Basic Definitions

Arts and crafts = combines creative and practical activities, often for enjoyment or personal use (**knitting, pottery, or woodworking, decoration**)

EX. 5-minute crafts

A 'craft = emphasizes practical, technical skills and making functional objects (pottery, woodwork, knitting)



Artisan = a person who practices skilled craftsmanship, often creating functional and decorative objects by hand, often using traditional techniques (handmade furniture, leather goods, jewelry)

1. Things which are always (or usually) true:

Water color paints normally dry quickly.

Jarod (usually) prefers to sculpt in the evenings to get rid of stress.

Dave lives near the big auditorium.

Anne works for a government agency that promotes art and culture.

3. Habits or things we do regularly:

Artisans <u>usually</u> **get** their ideas from nature and the necessity in their daily lives.

She paints in water color <u>almost</u> <u>every</u> morning.

Spanish word:

no tener nada que ver

False equivalent:

to have nothing to see/do

= no tener nada <u>para</u> ver/do

Error: The two restaurants have nothing to do.

False Friends (1)

Correct word:

(there is) no comparison

Definition:

the comparison is unequal

There is no comparison between the two restaurants.

Being young is an attitude. It has nothing to do with age.



Spanish word: pintar

False equivalent: paint

= pintar con pintura y pincel

Error: The kids did a great job painting the picture.

False Friends (2)

Correct word: to color

Definition:

to add color to a picture with markers or crayons

The kids did a great job coloring the picture.





Spanish word: publico

False equivalent: public

= publico general en la sociedad

Error: The performance was so fantastic, the public applauded for 2 minutes.


False Friends (3)

Correct word: audience

Definition:

people present at a performance

The performance was so fantastic, the audience applauded for 2 minutes. Ceclop
