
















Each team member needs to **contribute** their best efforts to the project. Success often **depends on** both hard work and a bit of luck. Achieving success can sometimes **rely on** building strong networks. Your success should not be **defined by** other people's standards. In some cultures, success is **measured by** material wealth, while in others it's about relationships.

Cada miembro del equipo debe contribuir con su máximo esfuerzo al proyecto. El éxito suele depender tanto del trabajo duro como de un poco de suerte. Para alcanzar el éxito, a veces es necesario construir redes sólidas. Tu éxito no debería definirse según los estándares de otras personas. Work around = superar

The team worked around the logistical challenges to deliver aid to remote areas.

Follow through = llevar hasta el final, cumplir, seguir adelante lt's critical for elected officials to **follow through** on their campaign promises.

Give up = rendirse

The government promises to not give up on its mission to rebuild the communities after the flood.

Work out = funcionar, solucionar, salir al final After months of negotiation, the merger finally **worked out** for both companies.

Work around = superar

El equipo superó los desafíos logísticos para entregar ayuda a áreas remotas.

Follow through = llevar hasta el final, cumplir, seguir adelante

Es fundamental que los funcionarios electos cumplan con sus promesas de campaña.

Give up = rendirse

Success & Ways of Living Similar Verbs

accomplish = the successful completion of a task or project with effort and planning. She **accomplished** <u>her goal</u> of finishing the marathon.

achieve = to successfully reach a desired goal or level through effort or skill. He **achieved** <u>success</u> in his business after years of hard work.

reach = to arrive at a particular point, position or level of progress. (goals, milestones, age). She **reached** <u>her goal</u> weight through exercise and diet.

obtain = to gain possession or control of something (tangible or formal) He **obtained** <u>his degree</u> after four years of study.

fulfill = to satisfy an expectation or make an aspiration come true. She **fulfilled** <u>her dream</u> of becoming a doctor.

realize = to bring into reality something that was previously only and idea or aspiration. He **realized** his childhood dream of becoming an artist.

Traditional Success

Involves **career** advancement, **financial wealth**, or high social status.

In cultures that value hard work, achievement, and external recognition

Achieved through setting and accomplishing measurable goals, often focused on work performance, wealth accumulation, or social influence.

Implica avance profesional, riqueza financiera o alto estatus social.

En culturas que valoran el trabajo duro, los logros y el reconocimiento externo.

Se logra mediante el establecimiento y el logro de objetivos mensurables, a menudo centrados en el desempeño laboral, la acumulación de riqueza o la influencia social.





Success & Ways of Living Types of Success

Personal Fulfillment

Success as a **personal journey** where fulfillment, **happiness**, and **mental well-being** are prioritized.

More about personal satisfaction, emotional resilience, and contentment

Focused on personal fulfillment might prioritize relationships, creativity, and work-life balance

Growth and Learning

Success defined as continuous selfimprovement and intellectual growth

Includes lifelong learning, skill development, and self-reflection

People with this view value challenges and new experiences as part of their success

Success & Ways of Living Types of Success

Contribution and Impact

Success is defined by making a positive impact, often through community service, environmental activism, or social entrepreneurship

Meaning in helping others, promoting social justice, or protecting the environment.

Achievements are seen as valuable primarily for their potential to **improve others' lives** or **society as a whole**

El éxito se define como generar un impacto positivo, a menudo a través del servicio comunitario, el activismo ambiental o el emprendimiento social.

Es decir, ayudar a los demás, promover la justicia social o proteger el medio ambiente.

Los logros se consideran valiosos principalmente por su potencial para mejorar la vida de los demás o de la sociedad en su conjunto.



Minimalist Lifestyle

Living with fewer possessions and focusing on **simplicity**, intentionality, and **decluttering**.

Aims to reduce material dependence, financial burdens, and environmental impact.

Associated with a pursuit of **mental clarity**, **freedom**, and space for meaningful experiences over material accumulation.

Vivir con menos posesiones y centrarse en la simplicidad, la intencionalidad y la eliminación de lo innecesario.

Tiene como objetivo reducir la dependencia material, las cargas financieras y el impacto ambiental.

Está asociado con la búsqueda de claridad mental, libertad y espacio para experiencias significativas en lugar de la acumulación material.





Digital Nomadism

A lifestyle enabled by technology, allowing people to **work remotely** from different parts of the world.

Values **flexibility**, **exploration**, and a **non-traditional** approach to work and residency.

Suitable for people who enjoy traveling, new cultures, and a more fluid approach to life.

Un estilo de vida facilitado por la tecnología, que permite a las personas trabajar de forma remota desde diferentes partes del mundo.

Valora la flexibilidad, la exploración y un enfoque no tradicional del trabajo y la residencia.

Adecuado para personas que disfrutan de viajar, conocer nuevas culturas y un enfoque más fluido de la vida.





Family and Community-Oriented Living

Prioritizes strong family ties, community involvement, and social relationships.

Success in this context is often about nurturing deep connections, mutual support, and a sense of belonging.

Common in collectivist cultures and among those who value stability and social cohesion

Prioriza los lazos familiares fuertes, la participación comunitaria y las relaciones sociales.

El éxito en este contexto suele depender de fomentar conexiones profundas, apoyo mutuo y un sentido de pertenencia.

Es común en culturas colectivistas y entre quienes valoran la estabilidad y la cohesión social.





Ecological and Sustainable Living

Aims to reduce environmental impact through sustainable practices, such as organic farming, solar energy use, and recycling.

Some people live in ecocommunities or off-grid to minimize their carbon footprint.

Prioritizes harmony with nature, conservation, and ethical responsibility.

Su objetivo es reducir el impacto ambiental mediante prácticas sostenibles, como la agricultura orgánica, el uso de energía solar y el reciclaje.

Algunas personas viven en ecocomunidades o fuera de la red eléctrica para minimizar su huella de carbono.

Prioriza la armonía con la naturaleza, la conservación y la responsabilidad ética.





Work-Centric and Ambitious Living

Focused heavily on career advancement, achievements, and professional success.

Often found in urban areas and competitive industries.

Success is measured in **promotions**, **recognition**, or entrepreneurial **milestones**.

Se centra principalmente en el avance profesional, los logros y el éxito profesional.

Se suele encontrar en zonas urbanas e industrias competitivas.

El éxito se mide en promociones, reconocimientos o hitos empresariales.





Creative and Artistic Lifestyle

Driven by a passion for creativity, expression, and innovation.

Many artists, writers, musicians, and creatives prioritize their work or art over traditional metrics of success.

This lifestyle can be deeply fulfilling but may come with financial instability.

Impulsados por la pasión por la creatividad, la expresión y la innovación.

Muchos artistas, escritores, músicos y creativos priorizan su trabajo o arte por sobre las métricas tradicionales de éxito.

Este estilo de vida puede ser profundamente gratificante, pero puede conllevar inestabilidad financiera.

OLD ENGLISH / GERMANIC

INFLUENCE

Prefixes: baernan (to burn)

forbaernan (to burn up) forbrecan (break up)

FRENCH/ LATIN

INFLUENCE:

High-status, formal verbs: destroy (détruire).

Phrasal verb form was less formal.

EARLY MODERN

INFLUENCE:

16th century- the use 'blew up' (exploded).... 5744 phrasal

verbs documented in Shakespear's works!!!

MODERN INFLUENCE:

Practical & creative evolution; 3-part phrasal verbs like

'put up with' (tolerate) and 'do away with' (abolish)

TYPES of Phrasal Verbs!!!

Figurative (Idiomatic)

put + on

She is a drama queen and always puts on an act.

Ella es una reina del drama y siempre actúa.

carry + out

He carried out his duties with great profesionalism.

look + up

If you don't know a defnition you can look it up on Google in seconds.

Si no conoces una definición, puede buscarla en Google en segundos.

Preposition ASSOCIATION tendencies

UP = to a higher level, more completely, upward direction

speak vs speak up = speak louder
clean vs clean up = clean, pick up and put things away
use vs use up = use completely
buy vs buy up = buy all of the supply
fill vs fill up = fill to the top level
set vs set up = assemble or arrange
clear vs clear up = eliminate confusion
pick vs pick up = grab and lift; learn new info & skills





Preposition ASSOCIATION tendencies

OUT = toward final result / completely



turn vs turn out = to result a certain way, produce, turn off lights
fill vs fill out = complete an application
burn vs burn out = burn completely, become overly stressed
sold vs sold out = sell all of something
move vs move out = completely leave a house or area
run vs run out (of) = result of using something until there is no more





Preposition ASSOCIATION tendencies

ON = point of effort, continuing



work vs work on = point of effort, influence focus vs on = point of focus build vs build on = point of focus, add to previous building

go vs go on = continue 'going' (moving, talking, etc.) play vs play on = continue playing keep vs keep on = continue doing something hold vs hold on = continue holding or for support, wait, endure

carry vs carry on = continue moving, doing something

hang vs hang on = continue holding/hanging for support, wait, endure



Preposition ASSOCIATION tendencies

THROUGH = in detail, pass the process, over a longer time



go vs go through = review something in detail, experience
a (difficult) period of time
get vs get through = manage or survive an experience (usually
difficult)

put vs put through = connect a phone call, make experience something, manage the processing, talk vs talk through = talk in detail about a problem towards

talk vs talk through = talk in detail about a problem towards a solution



Natural Combos!

come back (here), go back (there)
break down, fix up (cars, machines, systems)
get in (to), get out (of) (car, small boat, space with difficulty)
get on (to) / get off (of) (bus, train, plane, horse)
look over, look through (documents, reports, operations)
hand/turn in, hand/send back (assignments, reports, forms)

open up, close down (shop, business, emotionally)
 pick up, drop off (someone + place)
 put in, take out (money in the bank)
put together, take apart (model, Legos, machine)
 put up, take down (picture, decorations)





























PRONUNCIATION CONFUSION!



Me: What company do you work for?

Employee: I work in a pine factory. Pines water, solvent pines. I was working there 40 years ago.

Me: I'm sorry what kind of company is it?

Employee: Pints, metal and wood.

Me: Pines or pints? What do you make again?

Employee: Pints.

Me: Oh, you mean 'pAInts'. I understand now. I thought you meant pints as in beer or pines like the tree.

Employee: Sorry, my ass scent is very poor. (accent)





PRONUNCIATION 10 TENDENCIES!

RULE#4: Pronounce double consonants as a single letter

Words that have double 11, ss, ff, rr, pp, zz, dd and cc are all pronounced as if they are singular such as the words "fuzz," "occur," or "fluff."

CC words as 'K':

account, accuse, broccoli, impeccable, occasion, occupy, tobacco EXCEPTIONS: CC as 'KS'






